#### **A Level Success**

This is an exceptional achievement by our students and reflects their hard work and the dedication of their teachers. There were many instances of individual success stories, including our highest achievers, Jack Bird, Alexander O'Keeffe and Georgia Price who now take up their prestigious places at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama, Bath University and Bristol University respectively.

There were also stories of individuals who through persistence and determination achieved their target grades and earned a place at the university of their choice. All students who decided to attend university have been accommodated, and now take the next step in their academic careers. We wish them every possible success and happiness for the future, and thank them for everything they have given to the school during their time with us.

#### **AS Results**

Once again, our Year 12 students have managed to bridge the gap between GCSE and A Level with an impressive set of AS results. There were many examples of students achieving above and beyond expectations and they are now well on their way in taking their first steps towards the all important university application. Special mention must however go to Charlotte Burridge, George Mainstone, Patrick Quinn and Bethan Phillips who all achieved 4 or more A grades.

A number of our students have also spent time over the summer at the prestigious Oxford and Sutton Trust summer schools, where they will have honed their intellectual curiosity in preparation for their final year, and some have spent a week learning leadership skills with the Rotary Club of Newport. ## Year 11 Success

Just when you think things can't get any better... Record Level 2 results!



Sincere congratulations to our fantastic Year 11 pupils who achieved the best Key Stage 4 results recorded by the school, with 87% achieving the Level 2 threshold. This figure refers to the percentage of pupils achieving 5 A\*-C grades. The percentage of pupils achieving a C grade in Science was 96%, 81% in English Literature, 76% in English and 57% in Mathematics. We were also delighted that 97% of pupils

achieved the Level 1 threshold, achieving 5 A\*-G grades or more and no pupil left St. Joseph's without a qualification. This is a figure we are particularly proud of as we continue to ensure that all pupils are able to achieve whatever their ability or circumstances.

These fabulous results are testament to the committed partnership between home and school and, of course, to the hard work and considerable talent of our pupils.

Some of our pupils' performance was particularly impressive, achieving top grades in many of their subjects. A special mention must go to those pupils who achieved 7 or more  $A/A^*$  grades or equivalent:

## Record Breaking!

With over 84% of our EAL students achieving a Level 2 threshold it is great to see how successful these students are in school and to see how they thrive in their academic studies.

When analysing what is a record breaking set of results for the school it was fantastic to see the wonderful results achieved by the EAL students in Year 11 this year.

It is also testament to the Inclusion staff, the teaching staff and to the pupils themselves to see that 97% of these pupils achieved at least a C in Science, 91% in English and 69% in Mathematics.

The GEMS department in school work very closely with these students to ensure that their needs are met and their progression is evident for everyone to see. We are very pleased to see that 28 of the 32 EAL pupils that studied with us for their GCSEs have chosen to continue their studies in the sixth form. We look forward to seeing them continue to flourish in the sixth form.



#### Year 10 Successes IT ALL COUNTS

Year 10 pupils also sat external examinations this year with some excellent achievements. Highlights include 72% of the year group achieving a C grade or higher in the short course GCSE in Personal and Social Education which is equivalent to half a GCSE. In English Literature, whereby the entire year group are entered, 76% achieved a C grade or higher; in Sociology, 78% of those entered achieved a C grade or higher; in History, this figure was 63%.

Hopefully, this success will help Year 10 pupils to build in confidence ready for their examinations in Year 11. We know they will make us very proud.

#### Impressive End of Key Stage 3 achievements: Year 9, it's only just begun...

At St Joseph's RC High School, we are always keen to celebrate the successes of our younger pupils, particularly those who have reached the end of a key stage. We know that the success enjoyed by pupils at Key Stages 4 and 5 is only possible because of the stimulating and challenging learning experiences available to pupils at Key Stage 3 which aims to foster and nurture in pupils a lifelong love of learning.

With this in mind, it is with great pleasure that we celebrate the achievements of our Year 9 pupils, 91% of whom achieved a Level 5 or higher in English and Science and 90% achieved a Level 5 or higher in Mathematics. This figure indicates that a large proportion of our pupils achieve the level expected. 85% of Year 9 pupils also achieved a Level 5 in at least five subjects, including English and mathematics which is a very encouraging figure, looking forward to Key Stage 4.


Particularly impressive are the pupils who achieved Level 7s or higher in at least 7 subjects by the end of Key Stage 3, an incredible achievement:
